How We Raise Funds

Memberships! Band Aides has a family and business membership program and conducts its annual membership drive each fall. All donations to Band Aides are tax deductible! Memberships are available at several levels. All memberships above the Maestro (\$100 level) are recognized in school concert programs (unless donors prefer to remain anonymous).

All State and Honor Band Concession Stand! Band Aides raises the majority of their funds through concession stand profits generated during All State tryouts in October and SEIBA Honor Band tryouts in January. Band supporters have been very generous with donations of concession supplies and volunteer time to make this a profitable endeavor for the Band Aides.
